Information for new and existing patients

The aim of this leaflet is to provide you with an overview of the things you might need to know about the skull base services team.

Who are we?

At University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust, we conduct patient assessments and treatment of skull base tumours. We have a dedicated team who deal with all aspects of assessment, surgery, radiotherapy, chemotherapy and follow-on care.

We do not operate a drop-in service. Please contact us first if you are experiencing problems. If you are experiencing urgent problems please contact your GP for advice or in an emergency, please use your local A&E.

Where is the department based?

Appointments could take place at various sites, depending upon a number of factors. Most appointments take place in Outpatient Areas 1 and 2, located on the ground floor at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham (QEHB). You may also be seen within the oncology clinic at the Cancer Centre in the Heritage Building. Some clinics are also held at the Centre for Rare Diseases, also located in the Heritage Building. QEHB has good public transport links. The nearest train station is University station, which is approximately three minutes walking distance from QEHB.

What happens in clinic?

Our consultants will see you to discuss your symptoms and conduct a clinical examination. Our team of multidisciplinary staff will discuss your case in our MDT meeting and every effort will be made for you to be seen by the most relevant consultant, alongside other members of the team.

Our team reviews cancer and non-cancer patients whose pathology is affecting the skull base. We understand that having cancer can be very

difficult for you and your family. There may be many issues you would like to discuss and our team will always do their best to answer your questions.

Clinical nurse specialist (CNS) team

Our CNS team routinely see patients at every stage of their illness. Their role is to provide help, information and support to you and your family. The Skull Base CNS will be your main point of contact and act as your 'Key Worker' at the hospital. The CNS role includes:

- Providing information about your diagnosis and treatment
- Communicating with your GP and community nursing services (as appropriate)
- Providing you with information about other professionals for advice or support such as: benefits advice, emotional support, dietician, and Occupational Health

We may see you in the Outpatient department or on the wards. If you are attending a hospital appointment and wish to see a member of the CNS team, please contact us beforehand and we will do our best to attend the clinic appointment with you.

We can also speak with you on the telephone or by email. With your permission we can also speak with your family/ next of kin. Please note there will be times that we will leave it to you to contact us if you have any concerns. This can help you get back to normal life without being reminded of your condition all the time. At times we are busy in clinics so will not be able to get back to you on the same day, but we will aim to return your call or reply to your email within one working day. Please be aware that this is not an emergency service. If you have need for urgent help, please call your GP or the emergency services.
